This letter is in reply to your correspondence to the Department of Justice, dated April 6, 2010, which was referred to this Office for consideration and response. I regret the delay in response. Your letter concerns AIG and their ability to fulfill financial contracts. You indicate you would like to talk to a Department of Justice attorney as to why AIG will not be prosecuted for "fraud on credit default swap contracts."

The Department of Justice is not generally authorized to provide legal advice to private parties, to perform private legal research, or to intervene in private legal disputes. Accordingly, although I understand your concern, the Department may not be of direct assistance to you.

For information on this subject, I am enclosing a press release from the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission regarding an investigation into this matter.
